
Souper Bowl of Caring Is February 2

Since that day, more than \$150 million has been raised for local charities across the country through the "Souper Bowl" of Caring. It has become a powerful movement that is transforming the time around the Big Game into the nation's largest celebration of giving and serving.

Through this mission, young people learn what it's like to make a positive difference in the world – as they collect food, raise money, and volunteer to work in charities that provide shelter

to the homeless, food to the hungry, and compassion to those in need.

What Is "To Our House?" from Gary Overstreet

CPC is proud to be a participating church in the "To Our House" (TOH) program for 2020. You might ask: What is this program?

TOH, a program of New River Community Action, has been in existence for approximately 10 years. The program provides winter overnight shelter for single, homeless men and women in the New River Valley from November

through March each year. TOH has staff members that participate, but churches in the NRV volunteer to help host the individuals and provide meals for them (dinner, breakfast, and a bag lunch) over a 7-day period. The program also works to connect the individuals with resources that lead to employment, housing, and personal economic sustainability.

What role will CPC play in this endeavor? CPC has volunteered to be a support church one week in 2020. We will be working with Fairlawn

Presbyterian Church to support New Life Christian Fellowship Church in Blacksburg during the week of February 16. The specific nights for CPC are February 19, 20, and 21 to provide dinner; and February 20, 21, and 22 to provide

breakfast and lunch.

Notes from the January Session Meeting

- The Session reaffirmed the Behavioral Covenant adopted in 2003 and agreed to follow its guidelines in 2020.
- Shelda Wills was elected Clerk of Session for 2020.
- A communication was received from the Presbyterian Children's Home of the Highlands, expressing appreciation for the second portion of the 2019 Thanksgiving Offering.
- The active and inactive membership rolls as of December 31, 2019, were reviewed.
- Two possible Congregational Outreach Projects for 2020 were discussed.
- Gary Overstreet was elected to serve as a commissioner to the February 13 Presbytery of the Peaks meeting at Forest Presbyterian Church.
- The Christian Formation Ministry Team reported that the Valentine's Luncheon fundraiser for the Montreat Youth Conference will take place February 9.
- The Compassion Ministry Team reported that it will coordinate CPC's support role in the "To Our House" program in February.
- The Session voted to adopt a budget of \$292,895 for 2020.
- The Framework Ministry Team reviewed the income and expense report for December that showed income of \$47,522.66 and expenses of \$20,383.54, for a surplus of \$27,139.12. Year-to-date income is \$308,484.34, and expenses are \$275,552.97, for a surplus of \$32,931.37. The team also reported that 10 of the 21 ash trees on the church grounds have been removed.
- The Togetherness Ministry Team reported that plans are progressing for the Churchwide Birthday Party on January 26, and that a "Movie Time" event will take place on February 16.
- The Session received an annual report from CPC's Presbyterian Women.
- The Session noted the death of CPC inactive member Edward Van Lear on December 21.




