## *Presbyterian Women News*

The Spring Gathering for Presbyterian Women in the New River Valley, Roanoke Valley, and Highlands Neighborhoods will take place Sunday afternoon, April 7, at High Bridge Presbyterian Church in Natural Bridge. Registration will be available from 2:00-2:30 p.m. The Gathering will convene at 2:30 p.m. and will conclude by 4:30 p.m.

The Spring Gathering will include a brief devotional; a "Peaks PW Top 10" hymn sing; a memorial service for those women who died in 2018; and information about the Birthday Offering, the PW Synod Summer Gathering in June, and the Peaks PW Annual Gathering in September.

Because the 2019 mission project for the Peaks PW is "Handbags for Hope," attendees are



encouraged to bring new or gently-used handbags for distribution to Domestic Violence Centers within the Presbytery of the Peaks. A plastic baggie containing toiletries and other small items (such as soap, shampoo, lotion, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, tissues, scarf, note cards, etc.)

can be placed in the handbag. Following the Gathering, the handbags will be delivered to women who are victims of domestic violence.

## A Letter from the Director of Youth Ministries and Community Engagement

Dear CPC Community,

As most of you are aware by now, the position of Director of Youth Ministries and Community Engagement has been cut from a full-time position to a part-time role as of April 1, 2019. Due to this change, I have been searching for other career opportunities that will better support our family financially and be consistent with my long-term career goals. I am happy to share that I am very blessed to have been offered, and have accepted, a position as Regional Program Manager - NRV with Wall Residences beginning April 1.

While I am resigning from my employment at CPC, I am in no way leaving the church. This decision is somewhat bittersweet, as I am passionate about the youth in our church as well as their families, and hope to see our church thrive and become a touchstone for our community. However, I will still be offering a ministry of sorts, working with individuals with long-term disabilities and their care providers to make sure their needs are being met.

I will continue to serve as an Elder on the Session, and as Chair of the Christian Formation Ministry Team. In this way I will still be very much involved with our youth and the future of our Christian formation programs. You will also see and hear me playing handbells and singing with the choir, and likely playing the piano for services now and again as I have for many years.

I am also very much committed to seeing that our high school youth have a wonderful experience at the Montreat Youth Conference in June. I will not be able to chaperone, unfortunately, but I have committed to seeing through with the planning of this trip up to the day they leave. I would like to thank you all here, as well, for the generous financial support you are providing through our Montreat Sponsorship program this year. This program will continue to be available right up until the group makes their journey to Montreat.

Lastly, I am deeply grateful for all of the moral support each of you has provided to me, personally, as I have navigated this position for the past 22 months. Sunday mornings have consistently been a time of affirmation and renewal for me as I interacted with many of you, listened to your stories and ideas, and took all of that information back to the "drawing board" in an effort to make CPC the best it can be. I am touched by the love I have been so freely given, and the relationships that I have built with so many of you have made an indelible mark on my heart.

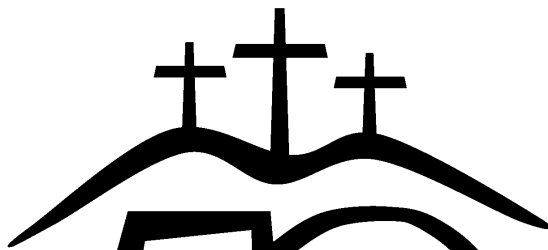

# *Notes from the March Session Meeting*

- Session members discussed Chapters 1 and 2 of *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory* by Tod Bolsinger.
- A communication was received from DePaul Community Resources, expressing appreciation for meeting space at CPC in February for a training event.
- The Clerk noted that some local missions that had been removed from the 2019 budget due to financial constraints have been funded now by individuals in the congregation (Habitat for Humanity, To Our House, Women's Resource Center).
- Shelda Wills, Commissioner to the February 21 Presbytery of the Peaks meeting at First Presbyterian Church in Martinsville, briefly reported on the day's events.
- The Compassion Ministry Team noted that volunteers are needed to "Feed the Flock" at Cooper House on April 23.
- The Framework Ministry Team reviewed the income and expense report for February that showed income of \$19,971.96 and expenses of \$25,324.85, for a deficit of \$5,352.89. Year-to-date income is \$36,224.89, and expenses are \$52,477.23, for a deficit of \$16,252.34. The team also reviewed the February 2019 designated accounts report.
- The Session approved a recommendation from the Framework Ministry Team that the 2018 year-end budget deficit of \$56,785.48 be resolved by using all funds in the Miscellaneous Income and Phlegar Fund designated accounts, along with a portion of the Davis Fund designated account.
- The Togetherness Ministry Team reported that the "Movie Time and Popcorn" all-church fellowship event will be rescheduled, that the soup luncheon fundraiser for the Montreat Youth Conference was a huge success with \$1,004.50 in proceeds, that an After-Church Fellowship event on March 17 will honor St. Patrick's Day and celebrate the ordination and installation of church officers, and that plans are being made for an off-site all-church picnic on June 30.
- The Worship Ministry Team reported that planning is underway for the Annual Spring Concert featuring Justin Craig that will tentatively take place April 28.
- The Session approved a recommendation from the Worship Ministry Team that Taylor Baldwin be given permission to return to Austria June 24-August 10.
- The Director of Youth Ministries and Community Engagement reported that a joint VBS is being planned again this year for July 22-25, at St. Paul United Methodist Church; and that the sponsorship fundraiser for the Montreat Youth Conference has been successful.
- The Pastor reported that he attended an initial planning meeting to explore the possibility of creating a Community Engagement Program in the NRV for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- The Session heard faith statements from and examined Savannah Hamilton, candidate for ordination and installation as Youth Elder in the Class of 2019; Dinah Arnott, candidate for ordination and installation as Ruling Elder in the Class of 2019; and David Andrews and Melissa Lawson, candidates for ordination and installation as Ruling Elder in the Class of 2021. Following the approval of their examinations, the Session voted to proceed with their ordination and installation on March 17, along with the installation of previously ordained Ruling Elders in the Class of 2021, Anne Greene, Tom Greene, and Gary Overstreet.

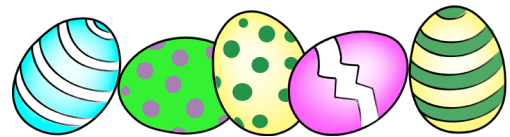

# *Good News Continues . . .*

## ***From the Practical Christian Living Journey Group***

*Last month, the Practical Christian Living Journey Group was pleased to share with our entire congregation good news surrounding the otherwise somewhat sad and unsettling circumstances in which some school children in our local communities live. After the February newsletter article was published, our Journey Group was surprised and delighted to receive an anonymous donation to help these children in some creative ways. We are happy to share the written correspondence that was passed on to us by the church office including suggestions as to how the donated funds might be used.*

FROM: Anonymous Donor

Please make the attached funds (\$2,000) available to the Practical Christian Living Journey Group to support the activities of Anne Lawson, MC School Counselor, to provide material, educational, and encouragement to the students in her class that all too often receive none of this care or love from their parents. These funds are to be advanced to Anne directly or to the Journey Group as the Group would direct. There is no expectation that these funds need to be spent immediately; let Anne and the Journey Group take their time to decide the best application for these funds.

Here are some possibilities how Anne and the Practical Christian Living Journey Group might consider applying the funds to benefit these students and/or even their families. Of course, she and the Journey Group will have additional ideas how to use such funds, and Anne's ideas should of course take priority.

- Pay for a summer camp that is dedicated to help students like those in Anne's class.
- Use part or all the funds to pay initial wages for an employer willing to hire one or more of these students and teach them some work skills.
  - o Working on a farm during the summer might be an ideal first work experience. With our offer to pay the wages of the student, a farmer or other employer might have a helper for the summer without any wage expense!
  - o Transportation to work and back might be an issue with which the Journey Group might need to help.
  - o Might there be some basic living skill classes that could be of interest to these students, even the boys?
  - o Basic financial literacy instruction.
  - o Perhaps a small garden plot could be tilled around the school that someone could guide the class in planting and growing a few vegetable items that might be ready to harvest before school ends for the summer. Lettuce is one food item that comes to mind. What might it mean to the students if they took home for their families something to eat that they had grown?
  - o Cooking classes. Bring in someone with portable equipment who would use hands-on instruction to create some dishes that the students could take home. One never knows; after some possible initial reluctance, the boys might enjoy this. For these students to prepare dish(es) to take home for the family to eat could have an incalculable positive effect. One never knows.
  - o Bringing in someone skilled in "conflict resolution" might be a topic that once it gets started could be of interest. Someone who uses role playing might be best suited for this.
  - o Perhaps a well-known local sports figure could be invited to speak to these youngsters and give them a "tough-love" talk. Bud Foster comes to mind.
  - o Any number of other topics that Anne and others might suggest.

Question: Do these students have access to free lunches, etc., during the summer? If not, what might the Journey Group or the whole church do to facilitate meals being available when school is not in session?

This gift is not intended to replace any support that this Journey Group is or has been doing to extend love and care for seemingly forgotten children like these in Anne's class. Hopefully, these funds can expand and build on the care already being extended.

*The Practical Christian Living Journey Group challenges all of us to offer suggestions and expand on the ideas offered how these funds might be used to help these students.
