Parsonally Speaking . . .

Do you remember the old "red hymnal" that so many Presbyterian churches, including CPC, once used? It contained one of my all-time favorite hymns, which, unfortunately, did not make it into the hymnal we're now using.

I'm referring to the hymn, "Be Still, My Soul." The words (originally a poem) were written in 1752 by a German woman, Katharina von Schlegel. Later, in 1899, the poem was paired



with the tune FINLANDIA by a Finnish composer, Jean Sibelius.

I woke up the other morning humming this hymn to myself. Does that ever happen to you... the moment you

awake, a piece of music has arisen from some unconscious place within and greets you at the very start of the day?

Given the uncertain and stressful times we're living in these days, it was quite a blessing to me that "Be Still My Soul" welcomed me to a new day that morning. "God works in mysterious ways," they say, and the words and music were just what I needed, just when I needed it. Through people of another place and time, God spoke to me, here and now.

Here are the words of the hymn. I invite you, when you have a moment, to pause, savor a few deep breaths and slow exhales, and then mindfully take in the message of this hymn.

Perhaps God will speak to you through it as well.

Be still, my soul: the Lord is on thy side; bear patiently the cross of grief or pain; leave to thy God to order and provide; in every change He faithful will remain. Be still, my soul: thy best, thy heavenly Friend through thorny ways leads to a joyful end.

Be still, my soul: thy God doth undertake to guide the future as He has the past.
Thy hope, thy confidence let nothing shake; all now mysterious shall be bright at last.
Be still, my soul: the waves and winds still know His voice, who ruled them while He dwelt below.

Be still, my soul: the hour is hastening on when we shall be forever with the Lord, when disappointment, grief, and fear are gone, sorrow forgot, love's purest joys restored. Be still, my soul: when change and tears are past, all safe and blessed we shall meet at last.


Attention, High School Graduates!

A Message from CPC's Session

Dear CPC Members and Friends,

Greetings and blessings to all. We are in some challenging times right now, with the COVID-19 virus and the recommended limitations on social gatherings that the virus has created. So, we wanted to reach out to our CPC family to wish you well. We encourage you to follow as closely as possible the

hygiene guidelines that have been established, in order to stay healthy during these times.

In an online meeting on Sunday, March 22, the Session made some important decisions related to everyone's health and well-being and the on-going life of our church during this difficult time:

- All on-site church activities are suspended through April 30 (no on-site Worship Services, Journey Groups, choir rehearsals, face-to-face meetings, Holy Week or Easter-related events, etc.). If for any reason the April 30 date is changed, we will let everyone know as soon as possible.
- An online abbreviated Worship Service will be streamed live each Sunday of the coming
 weeks at 10:30 a.m. To foster a sense of congregational oneness, everyone is invited to set that
 time apart to worship "together in our separateness." The services will be recorded and will be
 available at other times as well. To access the service in real time, or the recorded version at a later

- A brief, twice-weekly (Tuesdays and Thursdays) online devotional time, along with church announcements, prayer concerns, etc., is available by clicking the same link.

Even though we are not meeting together, we still have financial obligations, including our staff and the costs to maintain and support our facilities. We humbly request, as you are able, that you continue your financial support of our church. You can mail checks directly to the church (107 West Main Street, Christiansburg, VA 24073). Or, you might wish to consider setting up a direct payment to CPC from your bank. If you would like to do this and you are not sure how to proceed, members of the Framework Ministry Team would be willing to help. We plan to be checking in with everyone by phone over the coming days, so you may get a call from a number you don't readily recognize. Notes from the March Session Meeting

- The Session heard faith statements from and examined Emilee Horton, candidate for ordination as Youth Elder in the Class of 2020, and Bill Rhudy, candidate for ordination as Ruling Elder in the Class of 2022. Following the approval of their examinations, the Session voted to proceed with the ordination and installation of Emilee and Bill on March 15, along with the installation of previously ordained Ruling Elders in the Class of 2022, Dinah Arnott, Linda Crate, Pam Goff, and Kathie Hollandsworth.
- Communications were received from New River Community Action, UKirk Ministry at Virginia Tech,
 Presbyterian Children's Home of the Highlands, Habitat for Humanity, Sunnyside, Valley Interfaith
 Child Care Center, and Women's Resource Center, each expressing appreciation for the first-quarter
 benevolence gift.
- Speakers with volume controls have been installed in the parlor and in the Gathering Space.
- Shelda Wills, Commissioner to the February 13 Presbytery of the Peaks meeting at Forest Presbyterian Church, briefly reported on the day's events.
- The Christian Formation Ministry Team reported that it is working on a job description for the Youth Activities Coordinator position that was added to the 2020 budget.
- The Session approved a recommendation from the Christian Formation Ministry Team that Suzanne Dunn be hired as the Youth Activities Coordinator, pending approval of a job description.
- The Compassion Ministry Team reported that everything seemed to go well with CPC's support role in the "To Our House" program in February.
- The Framework Ministry Team reviewed the income and expense report for February that showed income of \$20,341.29 and expenses of \$22,836.51, for a deficit of \$2,495.22. Year-to-date income is \$46,515.45 (which includes \$12,750 carried over from the 2019 surplus), and expenses are \$46,188.77, for a surplus of \$326.68. The team also reviewed the February designated accounts.
- The Session approved recommendations from the Framework Ministry Team that the deteriorated wooden painted church signs on College Street and on West Main Street be replaced with new painted signs, at a total cost not to exceed \$1,000 using funds from the Memorial Fund; that \$6,000 of the 2019 surplus be set aside for the purchase of a commercial grade lawn mower and other replacement lawn equipment as deemed necessary; that \$643.79 of the 2019 surplus be used to clear the negative balance in the playground fund; and that the remaining funds in the 2019 surplus be transferred into the Building/Operating account of the Endowment Fund.
- The Togetherness Ministry Team reported that plans had been finalized for the Annual Soup Luncheon Fundraiser for the Montreat Youth Conference, that team members would assist the CPC Men's Group with breakfast following the Easter Sunrise Service, and that the all-church picnic and worship service has been scheduled for August 2.
- The Worship Ministry Team reported that plans are being made for the Spring Concert and for a special hands-on 5th Sunday Worship service on August 30.
- The Session approved recommendations from the Worship Ministry Team that permission be given to Taylor Baldwin to serve as pianist with the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria, July 5-August 16; and that \$1,000 from the 2019 surplus be allocated for the music program.
