The second recipient of this year's PW Birthday Offering is the Effingham Child Development Center Inclusive Playground in Effingham, Illinois. The Birthday Offering grant will improve the center's playground by helping to provide a protective play surface and allinclusive play equipment for children of

inclusive play equipment for children of differing abilities.

The third recipient is the **Presbyterian Homes and Services of Kentucky, Inc. Good Shepherd Community Nursing Center** in
Phelps, Kentucky. The Birthday Offering grant will help provide new wardrobes, bedside cabinets, over-bed tables, nursing beds, mattresses, and lift recliners for people who are sick, poor, lonely,

or vulnerable due to infirmities of age and poor health.

The fourth recipient is the **Wings of Refuge Restoration Home** in Iowa
Falls, Iowa. The Birthday Offering grant
will help fund a larger long-term safe
home where many more women
victimized by human trafficking will find

restoration, identity, community, opportunity and hope, and transition into independent living.



#### Notes from the April Session Meeting

- Session members heard a brief presentation concerning the possibility of creating a Community Engagement Program in the NRV for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Session members discussed Chapters 3 and 4 of *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory* by Tod Bolsinger.
- Communications were received from the Women's Resource Center, UKirk Ministry at Virginia Tech,
  Habitat for Humanity, and To Our House, each expressing appreciation for recent financial gifts; from
  Massanetta Springs, expressing appreciation to CPC for being a covenant partner; and from a
  member of the congregation sharing thoughts regarding the church budget and the Session's ongoing conversation about a new church sign.
- The Session approved a request from Pathway Christian Academy to use the Youth Center for its 2019 Spring Prom on May 4; and approved an offer from Rachel Sutphin to preach on June 9, Pentecost Sunday.
- A decision on a request from InStill Mindfulness SWVA regarding space for gatherings was delayed until additional information can be secured.
- The Session elected David Andrews to serve as CPC's Commissioner to the May 4 Presbytery of the Peaks meeting at Northminster Presbyterian Church in Roanoke.
- The Framework Ministry Team reviewed the income and expense report for March that showed income of \$27,931.24 and expenses of \$25,963.48, for a surplus of \$1,967.76. Year-to-date income is \$64,156.13, and expenses are \$78,440.71, for a deficit of \$14,284.58. The team also reviewed the March 2019 designated accounts report and the first-quarter 2019 Rental Properties Report.
- The Togetherness Ministry Team reported that the "Movie Time and Popcorn" all-church fellowship
  event has been rescheduled for May 5; that the after-church fellowship on March 17 went well, with
  UKirk students benefitting from some of the leftovers; and that promotions for the "Dinners for Eight"
  program will begin in the fall.
- The Session approved a recommendation from the Togetherness Ministry Team that the worship service on Sunday, June 30 (a fifth Sunday), take place at Nellies Cave Park in Blacksburg prior to the "All-Church Picnic" scheduled there for that day.
- The Worship Ministry Team reported that the Annual Spring Concert featuring Justin Craig will take place April 28, followed by a reception.
- The Session voted to call a Congregational Meeting at the end of worship on May 5, for the purpose
  of electing the 2019 Nominating Committee.
- The Pastor reported that he officiated at a graveside service for non-CPC member, Al Moles, father of Sandra Clements, on March 14; and that he officiated at a memorial service for non-CPC member, Tony Antonio, husband of Carol Antonio, on March 30.
- The Session approved recommendations from the Pastor that the Sacrament of Baptism be approved for Abram Thomas Peeples, son of Taylor and Chelsea Peeples, on May 5, with Abram's grandparents (Rev. Cheryl Peeples, Elder John Peeples, and Elder Jennifer Makin) assisting; and that the date of the May Session meeting be changed to May 7.
