

Parsonally Speaking...

It seems that every time you turn on the news these days, there's a tragic story about a mass shooting taking place in the U.S. Sadly, even churches are not immune to this violence.

This is something no one wants to think about, but the numerous recent events of shootings in churches have prompted CPC's Session to consider the following parts of a "working plan" for how we might increase safety in our building during worship services on Sunday mornings:

- At 10:25 a.m. all exterior doors are locked, except for the main front Sanctuary door. After that time, anyone who needs to come into the building for any reason must use this entrance.
- The main front Sanctuary door is locked 10 minutes after the worship service begins. A peep-hole or window is installed in the door, and an usher is seated at the door for the entire service in order to monitor the entrance and welcome people to enter, as appropriate.
- The balcony is no longer used. The balcony stairway doors are kept locked at all times, except for a brief time to enter the balcony to ring the church bell, prior to the worship service.


I want to reiterate that this is only a "working plan" at this point. No official Session action has been taken on it. The Session would very much like to hear your suggestions about the matter of safety in our church and ways we might address it. Notes from the September Session Meeting

- Session members discussed Chapters 11 and 12 of *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory* by Tod Bolsinger.
- The Session voted to proceed with the painting of the Gathering Space (main hallway) and the purchase and installation of a flat screen monitor on the wall outside the Session Room for display of church events and activities.
- The Session voted to rescind the prior approval to purchase a LED sign for the church's front lawn and to repair the current sign instead.
- CPC is seeking someone to maintain the church's website.
- Session members continued discussing a possible plan for increasing building security during
 worship services on Sunday mornings. Information will be shared with the congregation through
 weekly bulletins and the newsletter.
- Emily and Rachel Sutphin served as CPC's commissioners to the August 17 Presbytery Meeting at the Presbytery Office in Lynchburg. At that meeting, Rachel, who has now completed her year as an Inquirer for the Ministry, was formally received as a Candidate in the ordination process.
- The Christian Formation Ministry Team reported that a meeting will take place with youth and parents after worship on October 6 to discuss the future of youth ministry at CPC.
- The Compassion Ministry Team reported that volunteers have been secured for the "Feed the Flock" dates this fall.
- The Framework Ministry Team reviewed the income and expense report for August that showed income of \$24,091.24 and expenses of \$21,180.81, for a surplus of \$2,910.43. Year-to-date income is \$178,017.30, and expenses are \$189,441.39, for a deficit of \$11,424.09. The team also reviewed the August 2019 designated accounts report. The team noted that the ash tree by the playground has been removed, and the town plans to remove the ash trees at the back of the church lawn along College Street.
- The Togetherness Ministry Team reported that the hot dog luncheon following the outdoor worship service on Rally Day was a huge success; that plans are being made to host an after-church luncheon, crafts fair/sale, and pumpkin painting and carving on October 27; and that the team is considering some ideas for less "formal" get-togethers of small groups of people.
- The Worship Ministry Team reported that the special "5th Sunday" worship service in September will be based on a Taizé worship service.
- The pastor called a special meeting of the Session for September 22 at 12:00 noon to meet with Emily Sutphin by Skype as part of the process for her to become an Inquirer for the Ministry.
- The Session agreed to explore the possibility of selling the manse to the pastor at some time in the future
- The Session noted the death of Helen Parrish on August 15.


